The Service Grants Working Group is divided into two streams:

- Local projects (in HRM, in our district or nationally). These may be in conjunction with Community Volunteer Service opportunities.
- International projects

SERVICE GRANTS WORKING GROUP:

The Service Grants Working Group will:

- Determine how to accept grant applications and establish a process
- Assess projects and conduct site visits as necessary
- Select projects and provide the funding
- Follow up with reporting from the project
- Share the impact with the Public Image Working Group
 - The Service Grants Working Group will also work closely with The Rotary Foundation Working Group to explore opportunities to increase the impact through either District Grants or Global Grants from The Rotary Foundation.

The Service Grants Working Group needs:

- At least one member to be the primary liaison for each projects with two or three other members actively engaged in the planning for each project (as necessary)
- At least one member to liaise with the Public Image Working Group
- At least one member to liaise with "We Fund Sustainable Projects" Action Team for opportunities with The Rotary Foundation
- Two or three members to review member interests and community needs for emerging community needs, in partnership with the Community Volunteer Service Working Group

PEACEBUILDERS


As a humanitarian organization, peace is a cornerstone of our mission. We believe when people work to create peace in their communities, that change can have a global effect.
